	<b>PHYSICAL EXAMINATION</b> <input type="checkbox"/> Recommended, due on _____	A <b>comprehensive physical examination</b> is recommended at least annually, <b>twice a year</b> for senior pets. Just as with people, a physical examination may be the single most important component of an office visit allowing the veterinarian to detect and discuss any medical problem noted.

Vaccinations help prevent this <b>deadly disease from being transmitted to humans</b> . The first vaccination is valid for 1 year. Thereafter, the vaccine is valid for 3 years in Wisconsin. More frequent vaccinations may be required for travel.

All of these can cause illness and potentially death, particularly in young puppies. Recent research has suggested a change from annual recommendations to boosting at less frequent intervals for adult dogs We have more information on the Consent Form for Vaccine Frequency, which can be provided at your request. Give several times to <b>puppies</b> , again at <b>15 months of age</b> , thereafter boosters are <b>due every 1 to 3 years</b> based on risk assessment. Leptospirosis should be boosted <b>annually</b> . <b>Titers for Distemper and Parvovirus</b> are a useful alternative to boosters.
	<b>BORDETELLA/ INFLUENZA*</b> : <input type="checkbox"/> Recommended, due on _____ <input type="checkbox"/> YES, protect my pet today! _____ (B/I) <input type="checkbox"/> No, recommendation declined _____ (B/I) <input type="checkbox"/> Not indicated at this visit	A combination of Bordetella, Adenovirus, and Parainfluenza in an intranasal vaccine or Canine Influenza as an injection. This is given annually or <b>semiannually</b> to dogs at risk to prevent tracheobronchitis ( <b>kenel cough</b> ) or pneumonia that is a highly contagious viral and bacterial infection complex that causes a dry hacking cough that can persist for 6 weeks or more. Dogs at risk are all puppies and those adults who are boarded, go to training classes or competitions, are groomed, or meet other dogs. It is also recommended for dogs with shortened noses (brachycephalic breeds) like pugs. Rarely this can be <b>transmitted to people</b> – if any family member is immunocompromised, this vaccine is strongly recommended.
	<b>LYME DISEASE*</b> : <input type="checkbox"/> Recommended, due on _____ <input type="checkbox"/> YES, protect my pet today! <input type="checkbox"/> No, recommendation declined _____ <input type="checkbox"/> Not indicated at this visit	A bacterial disease transmitted by the <b>deer tick</b> that affects both <b>humans and dogs</b> . It is a very debilitating disease to dogs, causing fever, arthritis, and can affect other organs such as the kidneys. Your dog is at risk if exposed to fields of tall grass or wooded areas. Hunting dogs or dogs who travel to the wooded areas of Wisconsin and surrounding states are also at risk. Tick control measures such as Vectra 3D <sup>®</sup> and Bravecto <sup>®</sup> should also be used to reduce the risk to the dogs and <b>people</b> in close association with the dogs. <b>Blood tests</b> are available to screen for exposure to these diseases. The Heartworm blood panel includes Lyme Disease, Anaplasma and Ehrlichia.
	<b>FECAL/STOOL TEST:</b> <input type="checkbox"/> Recommended, due on _____ <input type="checkbox"/> YES, protect my pet today! <input type="checkbox"/> No, recommendation declined _____ <input type="checkbox"/> Not indicated at this visit	A <b>twice yearly stool test</b> to detect intestinal parasites that threaten your <b>pet's and family's health</b> . Regular microscopic examination of your pet's stool should be done for early detection and treatment. Most intestinal parasites cannot be seen by visual inspection of the stool without concentration and magnification techniques. We also offer a Giardia ELISA test, a stool check that is more sensitive in finding Giardia organisms that a microscopic evaluation. This recommendation is from the <b>Center for Disease Control (CDC)</b> in Atlanta and the Companion Animal Parasite Council ( <a href="http://www.capcvet.org">www.capcvet.org</a> ).

Heartworms are transmitted through mosquitoes and are fatal if untreated. Preventive medication is available in monthly form. Most preventives also include intestinal parasite control and some also include flea and mite control. We also offer a Heartworm mini-panel for a small additional fee. This panel can be used as a <b>screening test</b> to detect disease processes early in the course or to determine a baseline for your pet that later can be referred to as a comparison. This panel includes: Albumin (liver, kidney, GI), ALT (liver), Alkaline Phosphatase (liver, adrenal), BUN & Creatinine (kidney) and Glucose (diabetes). We also offer a blood panel which tests for <b>Lyme Disease, Anaplasma and Ehrlichia</b> , tick-borne diseases found frequently in Wisconsin. Screening allows for early disease detection, which can be priceless in prolonging your pet's length and quality of life.

This includes a bi-annual examination and blood profile intended to detect many problems associated with aging. Blood test includes a CBC (complete blood count), Chemistry profile to check organ function and electrolytes, and a thyroid test. Additional tests such as x-rays, ultrasound, blood pressure check or ECG's may be suggested as indicated. <b>Early detection and proper treatment</b> and diet can improve your <b>pet's longevity and quality of life</b> .

Dental care starts at home by brushing with pet toothpaste, oral rinses, special dental chews, and feeding dog foods formulated to reduce dental disease. We recommend Hill's Canine T/D. <b>Ultrasonic cleaning and polishing</b> under anesthesia is recommended as needed to prevent tooth loss. Full mouth <b>dental x-rays</b> can allow detection of disease below the gumline or in areas not appreciated on visual inspection alone. Additional procedures may be indicated and discussed.

This is <b>permanent ID</b> if your pet is lost or stolen. It is required to register health screening results on the OFA website. Microchips may also be required for travel and health certificates.
