After the fifth week, she can have her meals increased to meet the demands of her pregnancy. We do not endorse feeding a raw meat diet or adding supplements to the diet during pregnancy as these can lead to a variety of health concerns. Please do not administer vaccines or any medications to your pet unless your veterinarian has prescribed them knowing that she is bred - even ear drops can be dangerous during pregnancy if the contain a steroid.

□ Her predicted date to whelp is ______ plus or minus 24 hours. A rectal temperature less than 99 degrees indicates she could whelp at any time.
□Please call for assistance if you see green, red, or black discharge prior to delivery of the first pup, hard straining for over 1 hour with no pup delivered, more than 3 hours between pups, or any other concern that her labor is not progressing normally.

□ The pups should be wormed every 2 weeks starting at 2 weeks of age. Examination and vaccinations should always be done at 8 weeks of age, prior to placing in new homes.
